In 1978 he started teaching at Jamestown College and in 1997 he became Professor of Theology at Whitworth University in Spokane, Washington.

Dr. Edwards was a Contributing Editor for *Christianity Today* and has written numerous books and commentaries. His book, "Is Jesus the Only Savior?" received *Christianity Today's* book of the year (2006) award in apologetics and evangelism.
